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**Departs Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane, Coolongatta, Adelaide, Perth:  
27 Jun; 23 Jul; 16, 26 Aug 2011.**

**Two weeks of wildlife, ancient tribes, unforgettable sand dunes and excellent Namibian hospitality. This safari starts and ends in Windhoek and includes abundant wildlife at Etosha National Park, a fascinating insight into the Himba tribe, the quaint coastal town of Swakopmund and the world's highest dunes at Sossuvlei.**

This safari is a semi-participation camping safari with an option to upgrade to an accommodated safari (additional cost). This means, that all participants will be responsible for performing and helping with certain tasks i.e. setting up the overnight camps (tents, chairs, tables), cooking meals and cleaning dishes afterwards, tidying up the campsite before leaving and packing/unpacking of the vehicle.

### Itinerary

**Day 1: Fly Australia to Johannesburg.** Hotel shuttle transfer from the airport to the Hotel.

*Accommodation: Peermont Metcourt, Johannesburg - 1 night.*

**Day 2: Johannesburg – Windhoek.** Shuttle transfer to Johannesburg Airport. Fly from Johannesburg to Windhoek with South African Airways. Upon arrival you will be met and transferred to overnight accommodation. (B)

*Accommodation: Vondelhof Guest House (or similar) – 1 night*

**Day 3: Windhoek – Outjo.** Morning city tour and the depart Windhoek and drive north to Outjo in the Kunene Region. This afternoon optional visit to a Cheetah Farm (own expense). (B,L,D)

*Accommodation: Camp Setenghi (or similar) – 1 night*

**Day 4: Etosha National Park.** Depart for Namibia's well-know highlight of the North – Etosha National Park. Afternoon game drive through the park in the hope of spotting a variety of wildlife. (B,L,D)

*Accommodation: Okaukuejo Campsite (or similar) – 2 nights*

**Day 5: Etosha National Park.** Morning and afternoon game drives. (B,L,D)

**Day 6: Etosha – Opuwo.** Continue the journey through the Etosha National Park travelling through the remote western region. Leave the park and travel through many small rural villages before arriving in Opuwo the Gateway to the Kaokoveld region. Depending on arrival time, explore a traditional Himba Village this afternoon or the following morning. This will be a journey of cultural exchange and learning and understanding the last traditional tribe in Namibia, the Ova-Himba. (B,L,D)

*Accommodation: Opuwo Country Hotel (or similar)*

**Day 7: Palmwag.** Depart for Palmwag, home to the desert elephants. (B,L,D)

*Accommodation: Campsite at Palmwag Lodge (or similar) – 1 night*

**Day 8: Brandberg.** Today head for Brandberg, the highest mountain in Namibia. Enjoy a scenic hike in the mountains to visit the famous "White Lady" rock painting. (B,L,D)

*Accommodation: Brandberg Rest Camp (or similar) – 2 nights*

**Day 9: Twyfelfontein.** Visit Twyfelfontein, an area home to over 2000 rock carvings. Also visit the Petrified Forest, the trees of which are estimated to be 250 million years old. (B,L,D)

### Price Includes:

- Return economy class airfares including airport taxes from Adelaide, Brisbane, Coolongatta, Melbourne, Perth & Sydney to Johannesburg and Windhoek, return with South African Airways.
- 1 Night Pre Safari in Johannesburg – Peermont Metcourt Hotel including return hotel shuttle transfers airport/hotel/airport.
- Transfers, sightseeing and game drives as per itinerary.
- Use of full camping equipment (except sleeping bags), coffee/tea with meals, transport on the safari, 4 nights in basic lodges and 8 nights camping whilst in Namibia at designated campsites.
- Local payment of ZAR 1500.
- \*Pre-paid airport taxes. Subject to alteration until final payment has been received by our office.

- Local Payment of ZAR1500 included in the tour price, however this is to be paid in local currency directly to the tour leader in Windhoek.

**Day 10: Swakopmund.** Travel towards the Atlantic Coast for a stop at Cape Cross, the breeding place of the Cape fur seals. Continue to the charming coastal town of Swakopmund. (B,L)

**Day 11-12: Sossuvlei.** Travel from Swakopmund south through Walvis Bay on the way to Sesriem in the Namib Desert, which is considered to be the oldest desert in the world. On the way stop at the small settlement of Solitaire for the chance to sample their world renowned Apple Crumble. Visit the world's highest sand dunes at Sossuvlei, an area characterised by massive red sand dunes. Drive into the dunes is also available (own expense). (B,L,D)

*Accommodation: Hammerstein Campsite (or similar) – 2 nights*

**Day 13: Windhoek.** Leave the desert behind and return to Windhoek. (B,L)

*Accommodation: Vondelhof Guesthouse (or similar) – 1 night*

**Day 14: Windhoek to Australia.** Depart for Australia flying with South African Airways via Johannesburg. (B)

**Day 15: Arrive Australia.**
