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Full Day <b>Hanoi</b> city tour	A full day to explore the architecture and history of Hanoi. In the morning, visit the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, Ho Chi Minh's former residence, the One Pillar Pagoda ( <b>CLOSED ON MONDAY, FRIDAY &amp; EVERY AFTERNOON</b> ) and the Temple of Literature. In the afternoon, visit the Vietnam Museum of Fine Arts, the Lake of Restored Sword, Ngoc Son Temple and the Old Quarter. The tour includes a stop at an ancient Vietnamese "long house". Evening water puppet show ( <b>No meal</b> )						
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<b>Halong</b> Day trip with lunch	Depart early in the morning for Halong. Upon arrival, transfer immediately to a private boat and begin a four-hour cruise through the limestone cliffs and emerald waters of Halong Bay. Enjoy a fresh seafood lunch on board before returning to Hanoi in late afternoon. ( <b>Lunch</b> )						
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Half Day tour <b>Hoi An</b>	Take a walking tour of this quaint town, visiting ancient merchants' houses, a Hokkien temple, the 400-year-old Japanese Covered Bridge, and the colourful riverside market. ( <b>No meal</b> )						
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Full Day tour <b>Hoi An</b> with boat trip	Take a walking tour of this quaint town, visiting ancient merchants' houses, a Hokkien temple, the 400-year-old Japanese Covered Bridge, and the colourful riverside market. Visit to a family-run business making lanterns. This work is very simple and easy to do only with hand-work. Have a chance to design your own lantern from making the frame to gluing the cloth. Sunset boat trip on Thu Bon river to Thanh Ha pottery village. . ( <b>No meal</b> )						
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Half Day tour to <b>My Son</b> (from Hoi An)	Spend a half day travelling to the extraordinary ruins of My Son in a remote jungle valley. My Son was formerly the centre of the Cham Kingdom and has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage site. Over 20 well-preserved monuments remain. In the afternoon, visit a village specializing in copper casting, before returning to Hoi An. ( <b>No meal</b> )						
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Full Day tour <b>Nha Trang</b>	Enjoy Nha Trang's turquoise waters and white sandy beaches. Take a morning boat cruise to offshore islands in Nha Trang Bay. Afternoon visit to the Po Nagar Cham Towers, the Long Son Pagoda, the Cathedral of Nha Trang. <b>(No meal)</b>

<p>Full Day <b>Cu Chi</b> tunnels + <b>Cao Dai</b> temple</p> <p>Cost per person in AU\$</p>	<p>Drive to the extraordinary Cu Chi tunnels, just outside Ho Chi Minh City. During the Vietnamese War of Independence, Viet Cong guerrillas built the labyrinth of narrow tunnels virtually underneath U.S. Military bases, using them to hide during bombings and to stage surprise attacks. Optional side trips en route to Cu Chi include visits to see how rural people live and work. View occupations such as cashew nut farming, duck breeding, rice farming and production of rice paper, a key ingredient in Vietnamese cuisine. Proceed to the Holy See Temple at Tay Ninh to see an extraordinary ceremony practised by the Cao Dai religious sect. <p><b>Vinh Long</b> Day trip with lunch</p> <p>Cost per person in AU\$</p>	<p>Depart Ho Chi Minh City for a scenic morning drive to Cai Be, stopping en route at the ornate Cao Dai Temple in Ben Luc. From Cai Be, take a boat trip along the mighty Mekong River and its tributaries to view the daily lives of people who work and play on the waterways of the Mekong Delta. The trip includes a visit to the unique “floating” market at Cai Be, and to a family-run business producing rice paper - a key ingredient in Vietnamese cuisine. Lunch is on an island mid-river, in a local house set amongst fruit orchards and bonsai trees and then followed by a performance of traditional Vietnamese music. Cruise to Coconut island. Disembark our boat at Coconut island for a 10’ walk through the island to a coconut handy craft village. Tasting some tropical fruits grown in the region. Boat cruise to Tan Thach commune to visit a local family producing coconut candies. Take a horse cart to Quoi Son, walk to Tam Nen’s house to visit a bee farm, have a cup of hot tea mixed with bee honey and lemons. A rowing sampan takes you down a small canal shaded by coconut trees to the boat dock. By boat to Con Qui islands for lunch. After lunch, picked up by boat to return to the main town of My Tho. Visit Vinh Trang pagoda if time permit.
